Rabbi Glickman will speak at 7 PM on Shabbos afternoon on "Divine Knowledge and Free Will: Is G-d Responsible for Human Tragedy?" and he will speak at Shalosh Seudos on "Contemporary Business Law: How Halachah Managed the Shift from an Agrarian Economy to an Urban One".

Rabbi Glickman has served as a Rosh Yeshiva at RIETS since 2000. He has also taught at the Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law and is affiliated with its Program in Jewish Law and Interdisciplinary Studies and was formerly the senior vice president of strategic risk management and global head of corporate treasury for Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce.

Rabbi Glickman received his BA in philosophy from Columbia University and has pursued graduate studies in philosophy and religion at the University of Toronto. He also holds an MBA in finance from the Stern School of Business at New York University, where he was a University Fellow.

Rabbi Glickman studied at Yeshivat Merkaz Ha-Rav and received Semicha from RIETS.

He has published widely on curriculum, tefillah education, child and adolescent religious development as well as religious parenting. He is author of the 2014 National Jewish Book Award-winning Koren Ani Tefila Weekday Siddur: A Siddur of Reflection, Connection and Learning as well as a companion volume on Shabbat. He serves on the Editorial Board of the Koren Magerman Educational Siddur series and is Educational Director of the Legacy 613 Foundation Tefillah Project. He received semikha from the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary and his Ed.D. from Azrieli Graduate School of Jewish Education at Yeshiva University, where he also often serves as an adjunct professor.
