COVID POLICY UPDATES

Unfortunately, with the increased prevalence of the Delta variant, our Medical Committee has recommended instituting certain policies for our Shul. Specifically, please take note of the following:

1. While masks are generally optional indoors for those fully vaccinated, **masks are still required indoors for those who are not fully vaccinated**. Therefore, all children under age 12 and all unvaccinated adults must wear masks indoors.
2. If someone in your household is COVID-positive, then...
 - a. **Unvaccinated** household members may not come to shul (indoors or outdoors)
 - b. **Vaccinated** people should daven at an outdoor Minyan, when possible. If indoors, they must wear a mask
3. Anyone with COVID-like symptoms or in quarantine may not attend shul functions (indoors or outdoors) until no longer meeting the criteria for isolation/quarantine.

Continued adherence to these protocols is paramount. Ultimately this requires a bond of trust within our Membership and we ask you to honor that bond. Thank you for your partnership in this endeavor.

While we implement these policies, we pray to Hashem that He protects the vulnerable and heals the sick.

General Shul Information

Membership: Membership dues are \$850 per year and a building fund of \$1000 per year for ten years. There is also an additional community fee of \$54 which is allocated to the Teaneck Mikvah (\$36) and Eiruv (\$18) in our community. Affiliate membership dues are \$325 per year. The Shul's fiscal year begins on July 1. New full members joining after January 1 may pay dues of \$425 for the remainder of the year. Shul membership is available to those who are financially unable to satisfy the financial commitment described above. If a

member is unable to commit to the financial obligations described above, or needs assistance in obtaining a payment plan, please contact the Shul President or Treasurer. Any such communications will be kept confidential.
